

President's Line

In case you were wondering or perhaps you didn't even notice, I have changed the title of my column from the President's Corner to the President's Line. No big deal, it came from looking through the Newsletters that I receive from around the country where I have noticed there are a few chapters using the "President's Corner" for their president's columns. I arrived at the term "The President's Line" from my own track experience of entering, hitting the apex, and exiting a corner. It may not always be the right line; it's just the one that I have chosen.

Now I need to clear up something to those who have seen me leave the last few track events with a Lightweight M3. No I haven't traded in the Red Devil for the Lightweight, a fabulous car when running. For those not familiar with the Red Devil, that is the 1987 325 IS I have been using for our DE events. I bought the car from a college student who basically painted the whole car red except the glass, which was dark tinted and had to be scraped off to comply with the chapter's tech rules for use at the track events. A great car to learn in that is still street legal.

I decided to trailer the Red Devil for 3 reasons. First is that I've installed stiffer springs than you would like for a couple hundred-mile ride. The second is for peace of mind. Yes I'm using a car that is close to 20 years old for driving on the track. I've changed a lot of the components on the car but there are still some parts that are original.

The third reason is the tow vehicle. My tow vehicle is like having a home away from home. CD player, A/C, leather seats, cup holders, room for all my stuff, what more could you ask for. Those were the comfort features that I removed from the Red Devil, except for the cup holders, which it never had. Being able to just leave the car at the track and commuting back to the hotel, possibly with 5 people is a great convenience.

About the Lightweight, it's still owned by David and Peggy Finch. I had offered them the use of the trailer when they were sidelined with minor problems that made the car undrivable for the journey home. After strapping the

Lightweight down to the trailer, Peggy drives the Red Devil back for me. It's a great way to clean off the rubber chunks that accumulate on my street tires that I use for a wet track. She has probably driven the Red Devil as much I have on the street; I wonder if I should call my insurance agent and have her added to my policy.

There are some great Club events coming up in July. There is an Autocross School on the 9th at the Commerce Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater that Dave Ngo is in charge of. There's also an Autocross event on the 23rd at the Commerce Bank Ballpark in the Red lot.

Sunday the 16th is date of the Summer Rally that Rallymasters Jon Trudel and Doug Humphrey put together for our enjoyment. It starts near Liberty Corner in Bernards Township and ends up at the other Club event of the day, the Annual Picnic in Asbury. Registration is separate for both events and the information is available on the website. You don't need to run the Rally to attend the Picnic.

Circle BMW in Eatontown will be hosting the club meeting at their new facility on the 19th. Their program for the evening will be on maintaining your BMW. Expect the usual goodies when we visit BMW Dealerships.

Oktoberfest starts on the 23rd in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The featured model this year is the 6 series. You can drive to Grand Rapids in about 12 hours from NJ; ask me how I know.

Looking ahead to August 5-6, there will be a combined Driving School and Club Race at Summit Point in West Virginia, similar to the event that was at Lime Rock in June. It's a weekend event, so you shouldn't have to miss any work. You can use the on-line registration for this event. If you're staying at the Comfort Suites, you should make your reservation by the 21st. Well, it's time for my next chore, renewing the registration on the Red Devil.



A Rookie's Tale of Club Racing

As I listened to the other racers talk at the driver's meeting on Sunday night prior to the NJ Chapter's season opener at Lime Rock Park, it occurred to me that everyone had racing stories to tell except for me! The race marked my first event as a rookie in the BMW CCA club racing program, and now I too have a racing story to tell.

I decided around this time last year that I'd give the club racing progam a try. Since then, it's been a busy year of preparing myself and my car for my first race. It takes some effort to prepare for the program, but that is part of the fun! As with other BMW CCA driving activities, the primary emphasis is on safety.

This time last year, I'd been participating in BMW CCA driver schools for about 4 years and was just on the verge of moving from the intermediate driving group into the advanced group. I had also purchased a dedicated track car: a 1989 325is with an SCCA log book and one race in the ITS class. My goals for the balance of that year were to get some seat time in my new car and make improvements as needed for safety and reliability. I also established a goal of preparing myself for racing through additional driving schools and in particular by participating in the BMW CCA club racing school and to obtain my rookie license. I shared my aspiration to become a racer with our chief driving instructor, Blake Smith, and he was kind enough to provide encouragement and coaching along the way and to see to it that the instructors I have been paired with since then have all been experienced racers who have been very generous with their time and advice. It also helps to have a mentor currently in the racing program and I'd like to thank a few people for encouraging and advising me along the way: Alfredo Galossi who was a very successful rookie last year. John Allen from the Del Val chapter who is a highly talented driver competing in the KP class, and Phil Eiseman, also of the Del Val chapter who competes strongly in the IP class.

I'm not really what you would call a budget minded person, so I just made a ball park estimate of what it would cost to get started and forged ahead. I made the decision to compete in the KP class (non-M3 e30s are abundant and inexpensive) to keep costs down and to allow me to learn race craft in a car that is known for its balance and handling, but requires development of driver skill to make up for lack of horsepower. Even so, be forwarned that the words "racing" and "low cost" probably do not belong in the same sentence. I grossly underestimated the cost for equipment not directly part of the car. I economized by buying an open trailer. But the cost for the safety gear needed to start the program (and not generally required for driving schools) is not trivial. These costs include racing suit, fire retardant underwear, shoes, gloves, and a Hans device. By-the-way, I was happy to spend the money on those safety items, so this is not a

complaint. Then, there are other anciallary costs such as more expense for replacement of common wear parts due to the added stresses placed on your car during racing conditions, extra sets of wheels and tires, etc. Driver skill development is also a priority, so I've taken on more expense for driving schools than I would have in past seasons. If you are thinking about starting club racing and budgets are important to you, you should take all of these factors into account before starting.

All of this led to my first racing experience on June 12 and 13. My goals for the first race were conservative: stay clean by not bumping into anyone else (in BMW CCA racing, carto-car contact is strictly prohibited); get my car's first annual tech and BMW CCA log book; finish the race; have fun! I met those goals. It was a busy few days between practice runs, qualifying runs and actual race time. In racing conditions you are constantly busy on the track, the driving is intense, and since passing is allowed anywhere and anytime, there's lots of exploration of new lines! Traffic awareness and uninterrupted concentration are the keys to survival and safety.

Of course, there's a big difference between goals and inner hopes. My inner hope was that I would come out strong in my rookie debut and be very competitive in my class. In the first race, I placed second out of a field of four KP entrants, one of whom spun off track and didn't finish. In the second race, I came in last overall. I spent the first half of the race trying to catch another KP car and one of the JS cars, both of whom were running just ahead of me but were slower through big bend and the esses. I almost got them, then my concentraction slipped on the downhill turn onto the front straight. Things got very interesting for a moment, and just when I was thinking "I wonder how many times I'm going to roll", I realized I had caught the car and was back in the race. But by that time I had fallen behind the two cars I was chasing by about a quarter of a lap and there was not enough time left in the race to catch up.

I always thought I was pushing myself and my car pretty close to the limit in driving schools. Not so! I've found that part of the thrill of being in a race is that it forces me to dip into reserves I didn't know I had in a quest to shave off a little time from each lap. Judging from my lap times, I'll have to work hard to find new reserves and get into the thick of the KP competition.

Now, in addition to having my own racing story, I have set some new goals. I need to complete one more event cleanly in order to move from my rookie license to my full BMW CCA racing license. And then my inner hope of being more competitive becomes my goal. It should be easy. After all, I only have two things to improve now: my driving and my car!
