Summit Point Club Race

I hate cheating in club racing: especially when I get caught! Whoa! What's that you say? Club racing cheaters are lower than pond algae on the evolutionary scale? True. But, honestly, I didn't even know. Let me explain, officer.

Our chapter hosted a very successful club race at Summit Point on August 5 and 6. The race was a North American Premier Event, meaning that all participants received double the normal amount of points for their participation and class placement. This helped attract a full field of top competitors in all classes from a broad swath of regions across the country, some of whom were in a serious hunt for points.

On Saturday we ran sprint races in two race groups. Group A was comprised of the faster classes of cars, Group B the slower, with quite a bit of overlap in lap times between the two groups. In the Group B sprint, after a delayed start, we completed nine laps, or less than 15 minutes of racing, to get to the checkered flag. Early in the race things got a little dicey as Billy Jack Etheridge's number 63 KP car spun and came to a stop facing the wrong way at the exit of turn 5. This caused an accordion-like compression of traffic coming out of the chute into the turn. But good luck was

with us and other than receiving a love tap from the car behind me we all made it through without any substantial contact. A few turns later, after Billy Jack's brakes gave out, he ended up in the gravel at the far side of turn 1 with a DNF. Nick Rubenstein won the KP class and I placed second, ahead of John Wilson. Amongst the faster cars in Group B, Phil Eiseman left the field early due to an overheating problem, leaving the JP class and overall win to John Paton.

In Sunday's enduro all the cars remaining in the field were grouped into one big happy family for a one-hour race. It was great fun being on the track with the super fast C Modified competitors and seeing drivers like Chuck Stickley and James Clay (CM class and overall winners of the enduro) in action. The starting order was determined by the finishing order of Saturday's sprint races. That put me starting a few cars ahead of another KP competitor who was vying for the national championship and lusting for points. And that lead to a protest against my car. You see, I bought my car already prepared for SCCA racing in the ITS class. And the SCCA ITS rules are a little different than the BMW CCA KP rules. Namely, my car has an adjustable fuel pressure regulator, which is not allowed in the BMW CCA rules for prepared classes. If my car had been re-classified or dis-

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
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MEMBERSHIP MEETING INFORMATION and LOCATION

President

Neil Gambony reported that National needs all candidates for national offices by October 31.

Vice President

Brian Morgan reported that there was a good turnout for the monthly membership meeting at Circle BMW. Brian sent a thank-you note. A projector and screen are needed for the August 16th membership meeting. Ross will bring a projector and Elihu will bring a screen. Brian will be taking David Haueter out to dinner. David Finch - no report.


New Business

qualified, that would amount to the protestor having executed a pass for position before we got to the starting grid! Not a bad idea if you're hunting points. However, it turns out that one is allowed to run an ITS compliant car in KP, as long as this is declared prior to the race. I had my SCCA log book (which demonstrates the car was inspected for an SCCA race and found to comply with ITS rules). All I needed to do was declare that I was running an ITS prepared car, make note of that in my BMW CCA log book, put some decals on, and I was back in the running for KP! So my cheating offense, such as it was, was easily remedied and the race went on. In the end I placed third in class, eight seconds behind second-place Billy Jack Etheridge, and Nick Rubenstein again got credited with a win. I also learned a lot about the differences between ITS and KP car prep. I have the winter to pick a rule set and work on improving the car within those rules.

I owe special thanks to fellow racer Marshall Lytle, who lent me his SCCA General Competition Rules on racing. I had to produce this for the tech inspection team in order to pass muster with an ITS prepared car. I also owe thanks to Neil Gambony, our chapter president, who donated one of his mirrors (somehow mine fell off during a practice run) and lots of elbow grease to help re-attach my exhaust system which had been knocked loose during the sprint. Of course, this required a part I didn't have with me and I ran looking for "Ziggy" who graciously provided what I needed. These highlights of camaraderie embody for me the spirit of our club races and driver's schools, cheaters and points be damned!

Autocrossing

July 23 and Aug 20 autocross

July 23 gave us a great weather day for an autocross; our first at the Commerce Bank Ballpark blue lot. The modest attendance of 42 drivers gave everyone 11 runs at the short, demanding course. Where were you? You missed a great one!

This was our first autocross using our new software/lap-top/generator setup, and everything worked! The new results format will show complete results of all runs, and should be available much sooner. Our thanks to Mike and Brent for helping implement this improvement in our scorekeeping.

Long-time chapter hot-shoe and former autocross chairman Jim LaForge was narrowly edged out of first in X class. Jim brought a co-driver for his Miata; his daughter Lisette, who did a respectable job of mastering the course, and seemed to have a great time all around.

The August 20 autocross at the PNC Bank Arts Center had to be cancelled, as the south lot was trashed by the good citizens who attended the WKTU Beatfest the night before. Broken glass was everywhere (see photo), and it would take several days of cleaning to make it useable again.
